The injustice of a courtroom filled with unconstitutional representation at every turn is a sad day for our justice system, police officers everywhere, and judges that give their lives to our service. We hope to make no attempt at changing or distorting the facts; instead, we hope to enlighten and bring forth the factual evidence and testimonies that were smothered out and ignored during this entire process.

We have found, in a very short period of time, that by and large this is a story of epic proportions that has the potential to change law enforcement across this country.
